

**Wyoming Oil and Gas Conservation Commission
Hearing Wrap-up Report
February 2017**



The Wyoming Oil and Gas Conservation Commission held its monthly hearing February 14, 2017 at 9 a.m. Commissioners attending were Bridget Hill, Tom Drean, Mark Doelger and Tom Fitzsimmons. Also attending the hearing were Supervisor Mark Watson and Attorneys Eric Easton and Michael Armstrong.

The February 2017 Hearing docket showed:

- 150 Total Applications
- 32 applications continued
- 3 applications withdrawn
- 88 examiner hearings
- 17 applications to be heard by the Commission

At the preliminary session of the February 14, 2017 hearings, the Commissioners approved:

- The examiners' recommendations for the January 2017 hearing matters;
- The withdrawal of Docket Nos. 107-2016, 117-2017 and 299-2017;
- The following status changes:
 - 1196- and 1197-2016 - continued to March
 - 1293- through 1302-2016, and 128- through 130-2017 - continued to March
 - 223-2016 - continued to April
 - 206- and 300-2017 - continued to April
 - 106-2016 - continued to May
 - 149- and 150-2016 - continued to May
 - 670-2016 - continued to March

Before the Commission:

Docket 670-2016: Due to Bankruptcy proceedings, Storm Cat Energy requested the hearing be continued. Commission voted to allow continuance for Storm Cat to March 2017.

Docket 370-2017: The Commission approved the following staff recommendations for Enpro

1. A fine of \$55,000 must be paid within 60 days for failing to do MIT's on wells
2. MIT's are to be completed or wells to be plugged within 60 days
3. Reed Engle 1-32 well is to be sealed by WOGCC

4. If items 1 and 2 are not met, Enpro will forfeit their \$142,000 bond
5. Going forward, Mr. Harouny must notify WOGCC if he plans to operate in the state in the future

Docket 297-2017: Commission approved Jonah Energy's request for surface commingling that will be applied to the entire field. This is the same method as used for common interests.
