Two applications went before the Commission

<u>Docket 1272-15</u>: Black Hills Energy went before the commission requesting to flare two wells. The Eklund 11-14/11-2NH and the Eklund 44-14H are both located in Johnson County. The first well has been productive since May 2015, producing from the Niobrara C formation. This is the only well in the Powder River Basin that produces from that formation to date. The second well has been productive since December 2014 and is producing from the Frontier.

Black Hills Energy requested to flare 125 mcf/day for 12 months for each well. Motion was moved to approve the request. Request was approved 4-1.

<u>Docket 955-16</u>: Vermillion went before the commission requesting to flare one well. The Coyote Draw – Federal is producing from the Turner formation. The company is in the process of building a pipeline. Vermillion asked to flare 115 mcf/day for six months. Commission moved to approve the request. It passed 5-0.
